How did you get on with Halloween? There are many reasons to embrace the current, more American style of going about it, like going door to door in family groups rather than letting children loose and getting to see it as a sweet hunt to fill their buckets. But I am still not comfortable with it. I do get it, that in many cultures there are events that face up to death and evil by using skeleton symbols, scary clothing and parodying demons. It is a

human way of bringing things we fear down to size. But I am still not a fan of Halloween. Maybe it is because it does have deep roots with the powers of darkness, and many a Satanist or cultic group has desecrated churches or graveyards at Halloween. It has a bad history. I am not at ease with the underestimation of the powers of darkness, which, in our liberal agnostic culture, are ignored. And it is of course an excuse for more heavy marketing of all the trappings which will usually be in the bin by the end of November. So let's move on. Let's look back to what Christ has already done, overcoming the powers of darkness, defeating death and bringing us once again into friendship with God. That is worth celebrating. David

Christmas Shoeboxes

Once again we hope to send Shoeboxes to Moldova and Ukraine this year.

Please bring your boxes to our Worship Services between now and then, with you **Sunday**3rd November being the deadline. If you can't make-up a shoe box, perhaps you could bring along any of the following items which could then be used to top up other boxes.

Each shoebox should contain the following new items:

- hat/scarf/mittens (or gloves)
- toothbrush and toothpaste
- soap and flannel
- a gift and some sweets

For a child: in addition, they can contain underwear/ socks, a soft toy, a colouring book and pencils or a jumper. A ball is a good addition.

For an adult: make-up/wind-up torch/paint set/pen and notebook/razor/shaving gel/jewellery. All items for a shoebox should be new and age appropriate. With the sweets a small bag of jellies/small chocolate bar for a younger child or for an adult a bag of mints/toffees. If you are short then please let us know (when the boxes are dropped off) as we can add to them.

Shoeboxes should be ideally wrapped top and bottom separately and banded and as full of new goodies as possible. Please ensure any food is in-date until at least Jan 2025.

The following items should **NOT** be placed in a shoebox: glass, medicines, playing cards or written word.

Finally, please do ensure all items are age appropriate.

Notes: Could you add the age of the recipient to your shoebox, as this will help at the distribution point. Also, Nick & Sarah have spare boxes should you require one. Collections of the usual items are on-going for future lorry deliveries, if you need any more information please contact Nick or Sarah.
