## From the Minister - Sacred Pathways

We are often encouraged to cultivate a walk with the Lord but in practice, what does that mean and how can we do that? And it is so individual, isn't it? I mean, you are so different what can you learn from what anyone else thinks is helpful? We are going to try this Sunday as we continue in our series on Sacred Pathways. So far, we have covered using our 5 senses, nature (see Janet's swan meditation below) and contemplation. I hope you have tried something new this week.

Sometimes I get a bit wound up when I am told what I ought to find helpful as my spiritual way of connecting to the Lord and expressing my faith. That is usually when it is not my natural way of approaching anything, but it has done me good to at least try other ways. Contemplation is not my natural thing as my mind wanders if I try to be still before God without even a Bible

to focus on. But I am better at it now and find it helpful despite my resistance.

The next two pathways may seem to be rather unspiritual. Intellect and activity are thought, by some, to be the very things we need to dial down to get spiritual. 'Get out of the mind and let things drop to the heart,' is often said, and to the activists we say, 'Be still...' So it is time to push back and encourage you to use your thinking and your doing as ways to encounter the Lord.

Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing" 1 Thess. 5:11




From Janet - Further to last Sunday's theme - drawing close to God through nature - I thought I'd tell you about our trip to Dawlish to see the new black swan cygnets a couple of weeks ago. At that point they were hardly a week old, six little bundles of fluffy feathers already able to paddle furiously to stay close to their parents at the foot of the weir on the river in the centre of Dawlish. However, as we watched, two of them got a bit tired of swimming so hard and scrambled up onto the adults' backs. One almost completely disappeared under dad's wings - just a strip of fluff visible. The other one disappeared momentarily and then a little head appeared between mum's wings. The photo shows a second one climbing up onto mum's back. In the end, amazingly, five cygnets had taken shelter on her back, completely hidden apart from two little heads bobbing up to see where they were going. We'd never seen this before and it brought to mind the verses about being under the shadow of God's wings, so I checked the references when I got home. There are several verses in Psalms including:

'He will cover you with his feathers and under his wings you will find refuge; his faithfulness will be your shield and rampart.' (Ps 91:4)

'From the ends of the earth I call to you, I call as my heart grows faint; lead me to the rock that is higher than I. For you have been my refuge, a strong tower against the foe. I long to dwell in your tent for ever and take refuge in the shelter of your wings.' (Ps 61:4)

And also Psalms 17, 57 and Psalm 63 which Mike read on Sunday.



I'd read these words many times, but they came vividly to life when I saw how completely the cygnets were protected, safe on their parents' backs, hidden from predators and no longer having to paddle furiously in the fast-flowing water.

I also listened to a song I hadn't heard for years - Chris Bowater singing 'Under the

Shadow' which is based on these Scriptures.

## Christmas Shoeboxes

Once again we hope to send Shoeboxes to Moldova and Ukraine this year.

Please bring your boxes to our Worship Services between now and then, with you **Sunday**3<sup>rd</sup> **November** being the deadline. If you can't make-up a shoe box, perhaps you could bring along any of the following items which could then be used to top up other boxes.

Each shoebox should contain the following new items:

- hat/scarf/mittens (or gloves)
- toothbrush and toothpaste
- soap and flannel
- a gift and some sweets

For a child: in addition, they can contain underwear/ socks, a soft toy, a colouring book and pencils or a jumper. A ball is a good addition.

For an adult: make-up/wind-up torch/paint set/pen and notebook/razor/shaving gel/jewellery.

All items for a shoebox should be new and age appropriate. With the sweets a small bag of jellies/small chocolate bar for a younger child or for an adult a bag of mints/toffees. If you are short then please let us know (when the boxes are dropped off) as we can add to them.

Shoeboxes should be ideally wrapped top and bottom separately and banded and as full of new goodies as possible. Please ensure any food is in-date until at least Jan 2025.

The following items should **NOT** be placed in a shoebox: glass, medicines, playing cards or
