An uneasy feeling must have descended upon Mary and Joseph as they hear of the need to register in Bethlehem. Such rules just drive you insane. What is wrong with your hometown? Christian Response to Eastern Europe Update and Prayer requests

Our Christmas lorry was loaded on Tuesday 3rd December.

This year we have sent a total of 5,500 Christmas boxes to Moldova and Ukraine. We are indebted to our team of dedicated volunteers who have been very, very busy for weeks ensuring there are no used toys etc., in the boxes, the content is checked to be suitable for the age and then carefully packing all the shoeboxes into plastic bags to protect them.

Our Christmas appeal was very well supported again this year, and we are very grateful to all the people who so generously filled the boxes. It is very expensive to make a good Christmas box, and many families and groups joined together to make a fantastic box.

Ukraine

Another lorry has arrived in Ukraine, has been unloaded and the aid distributed. This amounted to \$72,500 of aid including the much-needed generators which will enable a continuous water supply, cooking at the soup kitchens and lighting in underground bunkers at a time when the power supply has been targeted.

Some of the dual fuel generators and 240V batteries have gone to field hospitals on the front line and so are saving lives! Please pray for all those who have been injured and for their loved ones as they face an uncertain future.

We give thanks for all those who make this possible.

- Please pray for the children of Ukraine who can no longer attend school in person unless there is a basement/shelter at the school. Those without are having home schooling on the internet but this is often not possible due to the frequent power outages and bombing.
- We give thanks and pray for the Pastors in Ukraine as they try to find the words of comfort and support when they are struggling too.
- Please pray for Veronica who has lost the father of her one-year-old son (he never saw him), she was not legally married so receives no support from the state. Please pray that all those who have lost loved ones in this conflict will find the physical and mental support that they need.
- Please pray for all those who have been displaced by the war both within Ukraine and those who have gone further afield, often being separated from their support network. Those in Ukraine have often had to leave everything behind. We give thanks that we have been able to send money for food and wood.
- We give thanks that we have been able to support Pastor Viktor in the creation of a mobile bakery enabling the church to have fresh bread at their soup kitchen and distribute aid in the local area.

Please pray for peace, everyone is exhausted, and they realise the high cost of freedom. We cannot stop the war, but we CAN help in so many ways - it starts with prayer.

Moldova

- We are thankful that has been some improvement under the newly re-elected President Maia Sandu who started the long battle against corruption.
- Life is still very hard in Moldova especially in the villages and for those with disabilities who receive little or no support.
- We give thanks for the kind donations that have meant that wood and food can be bought

Life is hard in Moldova and Ukraine, but we can show them love, show them people care, that they are not forgotten. There is so much more to pray for, and so much to be thankful for.



- 1. Go onto the internet and type kcbchurch.org.uk
