A personal "Damascus moment", if you will - It is known to some, that in spite of 4 years of The Psalmists and many years attending Home Groups, I have struggled to connect with the Apostle Paul, I admit wholeheartedly that I have always favoured, and related to, Peter, flaws and all, and the Gospel of John is the one for me. The stumbling block to wholly connect with Paul, and some of his teachings, has been my failure alone - probably due to looking at his words through my 20th/21st century eyes. But recently, during The Psalmists' studying of Galatians 2:1-10 I experienced a truly revelatory moment. Through Paul's own words, Peter & John together with James gave me a pause for thought, demonstrated my woeful ignorance and humbled me by their unquestioning support of Paul and it struck me, who am I to question God? The few words of scripture really gave me a new perspective. Of course, everything no matter how big or small happens in God's time, our God is ever patient, kind, wise, loving and above all forgiving! So, part of Galatians 2:9, is where I came to that moment - "James, Peter and John, those reputed to be pillars, gave me and Barnabas the right hand of fellowship when they

recognised the grace given to me" - they recognised God's grace in Paul immediately - slowly, happily, but eventually I got there too! If you are experiencing a stumbling block preventing you from moving forward fear not, God is patient and will guide you through in His time. Amen to that! Sue

Lord, we cry out to you for your peace to settle on all the nations. Oh Lord we know that it is always those who are the most vulnerable, most neglected, and most in need who suffer the greatest and we ask that your arms surround them with your love. Christmas Shoeboxes

Once again we hope to send Shoeboxes to Moldova and Ukraine this year.

Please bring your boxes to our Worship Services between now and then, with you **Sunday**3rd **November** being the deadline. If you can't make-up a shoe box, perhaps you could bring along any of the following items which could then be used to top up other boxes.

Each shoebox should contain the following new items:

- hat/scarf/mittens (or gloves)
- toothbrush and toothpaste
- soap and flannel
- a gift and some sweets

•

For a child: in addition, they can contain underwear/ socks, a soft toy, a colouring book and pencils or a jumper. A ball is a good addition.

For an adult: make-up/wind-up torch/paint set/pen and notebook/razor/shaving gel/jewellery. All items for a shoebox should be new and age appropriate. With the sweets a small bag of jellies/small chocolate bar for a younger child or for an adult a bag of mints/toffees. If you are short then please let us know (when the boxes are dropped off) as we can add to them.

Shoeboxes should be ideally wrapped top and bottom separately and banded and as full of new goodies as possible. Please ensure any food is in-date until at least Jan 2025. The following items should **NOT** be placed in a shoebox: glass, medicines, playing cards or written word.

Finally, please do ensure all items are age appropriate.

Notes: Could you add the age of the recipient to your shoebox, as this will help at the distribution point. Also, Nick & Sarah have spare boxes should you require one. Collections of the usual items are on-going for future lorry deliveries, if you need any more information please contact Nick or Sarah.

Christian's Against Poverty (CAP) – We both attend regular Prayer Meetings for CAP, organised by Tim Wigley, the Teignbridge Debt Coach. At a recent meeting, Tim gave out an information flyer, in respect of supporting the local Debt Centre, of which Michael Trigg is the Treasurer. Specifically CAP is seeking financial support to help keep our Debt Centre running - it needs £1,600 per month to achieve this. Additionally, Tim said that there is a real need for helpers in the Newton Abbot area, as quite a large proportion of clients come from here, so he is actively seeking any help which you might feel able to give.
