From the Minister

Since the pandemic, so much more is done remotely. Work is now increasingly done at home, appointments with doctors by video link, church on Zoom. This has helped in many ways, reducing travel and enabling people greater access to meetings. And it is isolating us and those face-to-face skills get rusty.

The Apostle Paul, in his letters to the Romans, Corinthians and Thessalonians, encourages them to greet each other with a holy kiss. Our cultural equivalent might be a holy hug or a holy hand shake but the point is, it is physical and we are meant to have some physical expression of greeting where possible. It is good for us. And it can't be done remotely.

The Lord enables us to embody our faith. Baptism is a very physical act. We are fully involved when we are immersed in the water. And church membership is a very embodied act when we are welcomed up front at a communion service.

Embody your faith. Make the most of being present (health permitting). If you haven't been baptised, follow the command of Jesus and get baptised. And if you are not yet a member and yet KCBC is the church you belong in, come for membership. Easy steps, profound results.

Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing" 1 Thess. 5:11

- Anti Bacterial Spray. or Anti bacterial wipes

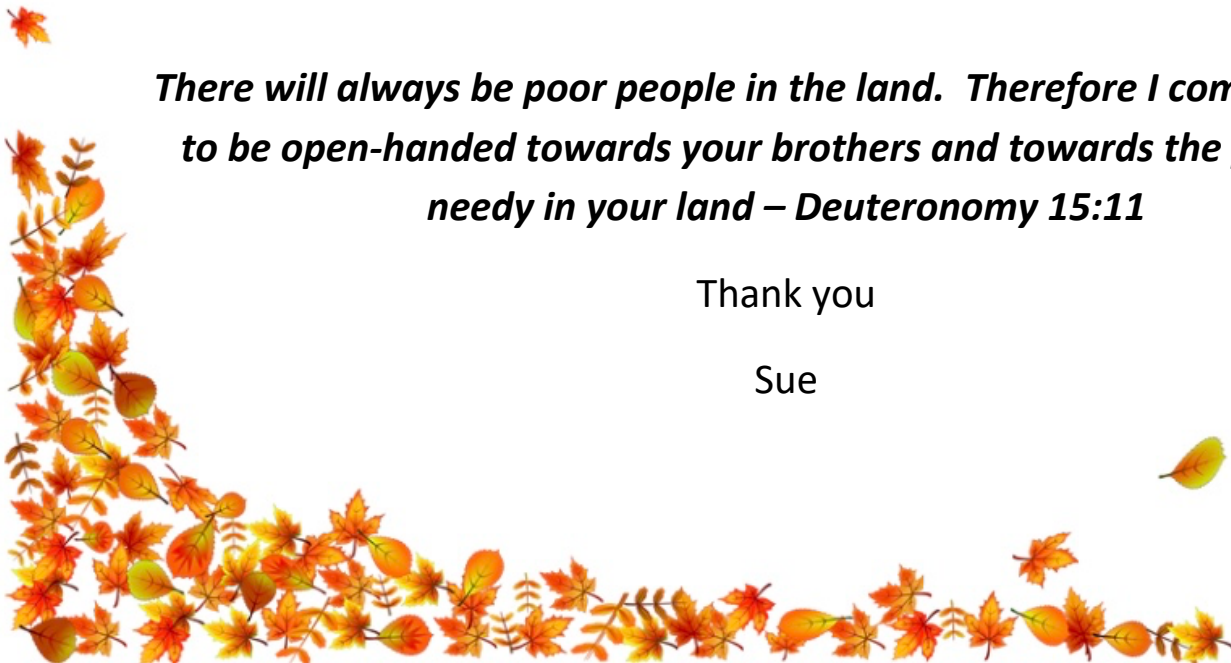
Any help you could give would be wonderful. Could I just add the reminder that any donations need to be in date, as the Foodbank is prohibited from passing along out of date products - thanks!

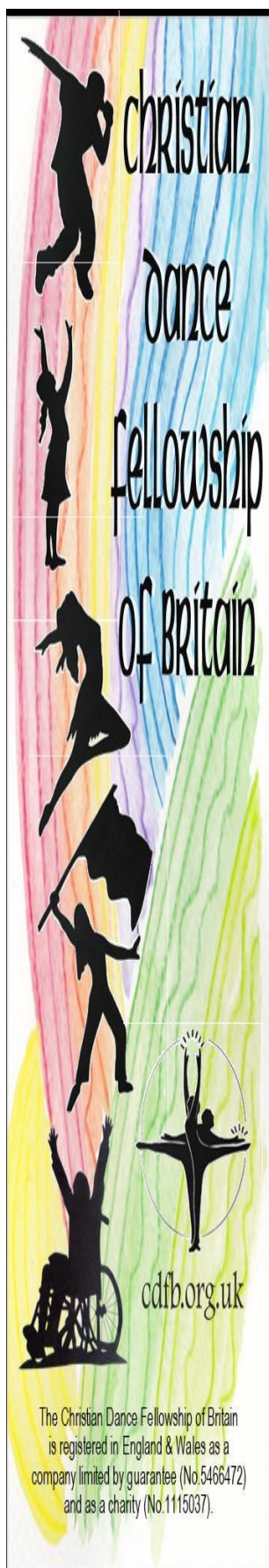

CR2EE Update

Our lorry has arrived and successfully cleared customs and been unloaded. Our thanks again to everyone in the UK who donated and loaded to make this possible.

There is now a huge amount of work for Ilia and his dedicated team to distribute everything to those in need, a task they will do willingly and efficiently.

Our next lorry to Ukraine should be leaving in about four weeks, so again a huge challenge for our volunteers in Exmouth. In addition to the generators, medical supplies and equipment, as well as all the other humanitarian aid we will be sending some Christmas Shoeboxes.

Shoeboxes

Once again we hope to send Shoeboxes to Moldova and Ukraine this year.

Please bring the boxes with you on or before **Sunday 3rd November**, if you can't do a shoe box you could bring any of the following items which could then be used to top up other boxes.

Each shoebox should contain the following new items:

- hat/scarf/mittens (or gloves)
- soap and flannel
- toothbrush and toothpaste
- a gift and some sweets

For a child: in addition, they can contain underwear/ socks, a soft toy, a colouring book and pencils or a jumper. A ball is a good addition.

For an adult: make-up/wind-up torch/paint set/pen and notebook/razor/shaving gel/jewellery.

All items for a shoebox should be new and age appropriate. With the sweets a small bag of jellies/small chocolate bar for a younger child or for an adult a bag of mints/toffees.

If you are short then please let us know (when the boxes are dropped off) as we can add to them.

Shoebboxes should be ideally wrapped top and bottom separately and banded and as full of new goodies as possible. Please ensure any food is dated for Jan 2025.

The following items should NOT be placed in a shoebox: glass, medicines and playing cards or written word.

Please ensure all items are age appropriate.

We are still collecting the usual items, if you need any more information please see Nick or Sarah

A few ideas for Christmas Shoeboxes



It's that time of year when many are asking about making up a Christmas Shoebox to fill it with lovely gifts for a child, or even an adult, in Moldova or Ukraine.

Use your imagination to decide what to put into the box, that way all the boxes will be different which is lovely.

MOST IMPORTANTLY, all items **MUST be NEW**, as we certify everything in the boxes is new and we risk the whole load being rejected and turned back at customs to return to the UK if anything used is found in the Christmas boxes. We appreciate this is costly but why not get together with friends and make one really good box. Used toys etc. is always appreciated but not in the Christmas Boxes.

If you would like to make up a box fill it to the brim with suitable items, wrap it in nice paper, seal it up and mark clearly on the outside the age and gender the box is for.

You will have your own ideas for items you think a child of that age, or adult, would like but here are some suggestions if you need some help:-

A good start is a tooth brush, tooth paste and some soap with flannel, maybe a woolly hat and gloves. In addition everyone likes chocolates, children always appreciate a toy, a doll, toy car or cuddly toy, dinosaurs, a tennis ball, building bricks (i.e.lego type), tapestry or embroidery kits, pencils, pens, colouring pencils, colouring books, sharpener, note books, socks, and, of course, sweets!

There's lots more we're sure you can think of!
